


The most commonly used characters for transliterating Arabic, along with the keystrokes necessary for typing them using the Alt-Latin keyboard for Windows.  
(For Macintosh, use either Option key instead of Alt.)



Alt+p = ڇ ('ayn)

Alt+shift+p = ڻ (hamza)

Alt+a, then a, i, or u = ڰ, ڻ, or ڻ

Alt+a, then A, I, or U = ڰ, ڻ, or ڻ

Alt+period, then d, h, s, t, or z = ڏ, ڻ, ڻ, ڻ, or ڏ

Alt+period, then D, H, S, T, or Z = ڏ, ڻ, ڻ, ڻ, or ڏ

To type ڙ or ڙ, first type Z or z, then press alt + shift + ; simultaneously.

For ڙ or ڙ, press alt + x, then Z or z.
